

Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs)

1. What is the MCBA Book Art Biennial?

- The Book Art Biennial inspires dialogue regarding book art through workshops, lectures, exhibitions and a gala celebrating the world's best book artists. The book arts encompass the disciplines of papermaking, bookbinding, printing, typography, and graphic design.
- Like any art form, the book arts continue to evolve. Today's book artists combine traditional craft practices with contemporary techniques as a platform for individual and community voice. Work may include unique book objects, altered books, graphic novels, 'zines, concrete poetry, conceptual, visual and literary works. Processes may include any printing or printmaking methods such as photomechanical, hand-worked, analog/digital, relief printmaking, letterpress, intaglio, and screen-printing, as well as hand-lettering.
- Today, books can be bound and unbound, made into objects, interpreted as metaphor, experienced
 as installation, and interacted with virtually. What unites this work is a focus on the interdisciplinary
 expression of narrative.

2. What does the theme Community Intervention, Independent Publication and Alternative Distribution mean?

- Community Intervention uses public space to create, share, and shape art.
- Independent Publication represents the production of work through grassroots means.
- Alternative Distribution refers to non-mainstream channels for sharing work with many audiences.

3. How much does it cost to attend the 2017 MCBA Book Art Biennial?
