You're a long-time member and supporter of MCBA. Why do you choose to stay involved?

I liked what I saw at MCBA, and wanted to help support the organization. It was partly as a nod to my friend (I often get birthday gifts for her from MCBA), but it was also a call-back to my early vears in Detroit, where my family had been involved in various aspects of the newspaper business since the 1870s. My great-grandfather was promoted from the print room to ultimately become General Manager of what's now the Detroit News at the turn of the previous century, my grandfather spent his working career in advertising for the News, and my father had been a reporter with the News and later. when I was young, was the editor of a corporate newspaper. He used to take me along to the composing rooms where old fellows banged out lead type, and to the print room where massive rolls of newsprint came off the presses. I, too, am a word guy—once a paperboy; now a writer, reader, and lawver—and was very affected by the tangible process of printing.

I continue to appreciate art in many forms. Even though I'm not an artist by avocation, I'm often deeply moved by it and want to support those who enrich my life with their work.

What do you think is special about book art that separates it from other art forms?

Tangibility, of course. Many other art forms avoid—or at least discourage—touching, much less holding, works. On the flip side, in a way, is the fact that text is a more mediated form than some others. To fully appreciate the medium, the reader needs to understand and interpret the language as opposed to simply taking in the piece without language.

Can you think of a certain MCBA experience that best exemplifies what you like most about the organization?

I enjoyed taking my kids to MCBA before they grew up and moved away. We were able to do some hands-on creative stuff that one of my daughters still remembers fondly as a special day of bonding with her dad.

MCBA is, for me, an important part of the greater community. It makes me happy and proud to live in a place where art in many forms—and books in particular—is cherished and kept alive.



Open Studio

MCBA's Open Studio programming is designed to provide artists with regular, low-cost access to studios and equipment outside of workshops. Work on your own projects in our well-equipped bindery, wet studios, print studio or composition room and enjoy the fellowship and camaraderie of fellow artists. Studio Monitors are available to answer questions or help with equipment, but participants must have adequate training to work independently in the area(s) they wish to utilize. Open Studio sessions are not eligible for Certificate credit.

A \$15 (\$10 members) hourly rate is available for same day, in-person registrations, subject to availability

Please note that there are no Open Studio sessions on 12/18 or 12/25.

Open Studio: Letterpress

Tuesdays; 3-9pm \$50 (\$45 members)

Set type, make polymer plates, and print on MCBA's presses. Press reservations are first-come-firstserved. Fee covers inks and solvents; supply your own paper.

Open Studio: Bookbinding

Tuesdays; 3-9pm \$50 (\$45 members)

Fee covers use of binding tools and cutting equipment, plus some consumables (thread and PVA). Supply your own bookboard, cloth, paper, and other needs. Completion of **Cutting Equipment Training** is required before using the bindery cutting equipment independently. Check our website for monthly training dates and times.



Intaglio printmaking is a highly versatile medium utilized by artists in all fields as a direct process that encourages a rich variety of marks, tonal surfaces, and layer interaction. This course will demonstrate various drypoint techniques and processes for executing small fine art editions. Processes covered will include; direct drawing, creating tonal areas, wiping, and printing.

Non-Adhesive Bindings: Elegance Without Glue


Non-adhesive bindings are simple yet elegant choices for small editions and artist's books. Make four bindings: a two-section pamphlet stitch with ribbon closure, an Asian stab binding, the dos equis binding, and a chevron long-stitch book. Explore material and design options with a variety of decorative papers for covers and text papers for book blocks. More alternative forms may be discussed.

Introduction to Design: Color and Composition

with Laura Brown

Developing a visual language is essential for any artist. This two-day workshop will provide participants with a framework for creating images through exercises that emphasize experimentation and play. With a focus on color relationships and their effect on composition, methods will include collage, drawing, watercolor painting, and rubber stamp carving, and printing.



Dimensional Papermaking with Bridget O'Malley

Participants will have access to fibers including cotton, abaca, kozo, and flax and will learn to use a variety of plaster molds and armatures to create paper forms and volumes, as well as flexible molds which can be used to manipulate paper into a variety of shapes.

D.I.Y. Bindery Tools

Outfit yourself for binding at home! Students will make a collapsible punching cradle, studio weights, press boards, two awls, and a case for binding needles—all essential tools for successful bookmaking. Boxmaking experience helpful but not required.

Cartonnage: Variations on Box Design

Modern cartonnage grows out of the long standing French tradition of covering small, unique containers with marbled papers and decorative materials. Create two boxes with lids, one with curved ends and the other with angled ends, to demonstrate how one basic structure can be developed into a variety of boxes and containers. Learn/review the basics of cartonnage design and construction using various boards, measuring, cutting, and applying decorative papers.



Polymer Platemaking for Letterpress

Turn digital files, line drawings and more into polymer! Learn about the use and operation of MCBA's polymer platemaker, analog and digital negatives creation, options for digital file preparations, and use of plates on the Vandercook press.

Knife Sharpening for Leather Paring

Learn to set the bevel and hone your leather knife to a finished edge ready to pare leather for bookbinding. Supply fee includes a paring knife and a honing apparatus of abrasive papers which can be used to maintain a fine edge. Required for Advanced Binding II: Full Leather Binding.

Diffusion Dither to Vector Line Art: Digital File Preparation for Platemaking

From etchings to photographs, learn how to achieve optimal results in translating imagery into photopolymer plates for letterpress. Explore a variety of options for digitally preparing your imagery for letterpress printing, including scanning and converting grayscale images to bitmaps, alternative methods of halftoning such as diffusion dithers, and strategies for color separations. While primarily a computer class, participants will get an opportunity to image film and make a 5 x 7 inch polymer plate.

Little Boxes

Get beyond cute and create small, well-crafted containers to put those tiny things in order. Adapting materials and processes for working small has been the focus of the instructor's own work for many years. These intricate skills, along with traditional boxmaking techniques, will be used to make four different little boxes out of bookbinders' board and paper: a cube with a detachable lid, a cigar-style box with a hinged lid, a double match box, and a portfolio box. This course covers material selection, precise measurement, and preparation, as well as ideas for tiny things to put in boxes.



Paper Marbling: Patterns I (A)

with Sally Power

Patterns are an essential technique of marbling. This workshop will focus on patterns, such as nonpareil, chevron, and their variations. Learn how a single traditional marbling pattern is a starting point for multiple variations. Advanced Bookbinding I: Half-Bound Leather

This class will introduce using leather in bindings. Students will sew a blank book on sunken cords with a tube spine lining to make a smooth rounded back to this binding. The binding will be finished with a leather covered spine and corners and hand marbled paper. The class will concentrate on the tools and techniques used with leather binding, including sharpening knives, paring leather and adhesives. Previous binding experience required.

This class combines readings, discussions, and lectures on various topics ranging from the development of book structures to the nuts and bolts of professional practices. Artists will deliver lectures on their areas of expertise.

Japanese-inspired Visual Journals with Sheila Asato

Visual journals are a wonderful tool for getting the creative juices flowing, developing new ideas and exploring materials and methods from other cultures. In this class, you will start by making a Japanese stab-binding journal. Then you learn a variety of ways to use Japanese papers into your visual journal process. These will include chigiri-e (washi paper collage), kiri-e (paper cutting), monkiri (circular patterns) and simple Asian brushwork exercises utilizing watercolor and sumi ink. By the end of the class, you will have a basic understanding of how to use a variety of Japanese materials that you will be able to continue experimenting with on your own long after the class has ended



Experimental Print Techniques with Julie Baugnet

Discover simple print techniques for making multiples using two different presses: the etching press and the Showcard sign press. Experiment with techniques in mark making, roller printing, blind embossing, and watercolor monotype printing which provide immediate results and promotes spontaneity in your process. These quick, inventive techniques are designed to inspire your next print or book project.

Paper Marbling: Special Effects with Sally Power




