How long have you been involved at MCBA?

I have been taking classes at MCBA for approximately two years. Having seen beautiful examples of marbled papers, I decided to give it a try. I first took Intro to Marbling with Sally Power. Then, I took a few more classes with Sally and eventually took a week-long class taught by Sally, Sue Bjerke, and Heather Fletcher. One thing led to another, and before I knew it, I was taking bookbinding and letterpress classes too!

How have you seen the marbling community change at MCBA?

Through Open Studio, adult classes, and the passion of the marbling instructors, I feel the marbling community has grown. Sally and Sue facilitate a regular marbling forum at MCBA, where we discuss topics ranging from paint and color combinations, to new techniques and tools, to frank discussions about our successes and failures. I also participate in the monthly marbling sessions at MCBA. Not only does this give me an opportunity to practice, but I also have the opportunity to learn from my fellow marblers. There is nothing more satisfying than sharing another's joy when they finally succeed at a pattern they've been working on for hours!

What do you enjoy most about paper marbling specifically?

I am attracted to marbling because of the gorgeous color and pattern possibilities. Every pattern presents new challenges, and it has been thrilling to expand my skills.

What do you appreciate about MCBA?

MCBA instructors are very, very generous about sharing their time and expertise, meeting with me outside of class to help me problem-solve. Members of the Artist Co-op have introduced themselves to me and offered helpful suggestions. I have been able to create beautiful books using my marbled paper that I enjoy giving to my family and friends. I credit MCBA instructors, studio monitors, and the facility itself for helping me create such lovely pieces. I have always felt that although I am not a professional artist, I have always been treated as if I am one at MCBA.

Open Studio

MCBA's Open Studio programming provides artists with regular, low-cost access to studios and equipment outside of workshops. Work on your own projects in our well-equipped bindery, wet studios, print studio or composition room and enjoy the fellowship and camaraderie of fellow artists. Studio Monitors are available to answer questions or help with equipment, but participants must have adequate training to work independently in the area(s) they wish to utilize. Open Studio sessions are not eligible for Certificate credit.

Please note that there is no Open Studio on January 1.

Cost: \$50 (10% discount for members) An hourly rate of \$15 (10% discount for MCBA members) may be available the night of Open Studio at The Shop (hourly participants may not register in advance).

Studios available during Open Studio:

Letterpress

Set type, make polymer plates, and print on MCBA's presses. Press reservations are first-come-first-served. Fee covers inks and solvents; supply your own paper.

Bookbinding

Fee covers use of binding tools and cutting equipment, plus some consumables (thread and PVA). Supply your own bookboard, cloth, paper, and other needs. Completion of **Cutting Equipment Training** is required before using the bindery cutting equipment independently. Check our website for monthly training dates and times.



Screen printing

Prep screens, expose and print in MCBA's darkroom and print studio. Fee covers screen use and emulsion; supply your own paper and inks.

Papermaking and Paper Beater

Get into the vat and pull sheets from your previously beaten fiber, or beat your fiber Saturday morning, then pull sheets in the afternoon. Supply your own pigments, retention agent, and/or inclusions if desired. Participants must register at least two days in advance. Beater availability is limited.

Beat fibers for future sheet-forming.
Beater reservations are first-comefirst-served. Pre-weigh and presoak all fibers to be beaten. If not
already trained on beater operation,
maintenance, and cleaning, registrants
must first attend a monthly **Paper Beater Training** session; check our
website for dates and times.

Create a replica of a simple but beautiful early binding. The Nag Hammadi binding takes its name from the Egyptian city where these ancient books were discovered in 1945. Sealed in buried jars, they date from the 4th and 5th centuries and contain early Gnostic religious texts. Like the originals, these models will be made from leather and papyrus, but with a textblock of 21st century paper. The pages are easily replaceable, making for a book you can use over and over again. Leather covers will be decorated using simple tooling techniques.

Platen Letterpress for Correspondence


