TOOLS

Essential

- bone or teflon folder
- small cutting mat
- scalpel, olfa or x-acto knife and extra blades
- scissors
- 12" ruler that can be cut against
- small and large glue brushes
- awl
- beeswax for sewing
- pencil
- 25/3 thread
- #18 needle
- PVA
- Paper "rulers," half inch wide strips of waste paper used to transfer measurements
- a finishing press or two lengths of 1x4" wood 6.5" long and two C Clamps (see photo here (<http://www.karenhanmer.com/teaching/ClampFinishing%20Press.JPG>))
- pair of clean press boards, roughly 6x9" is ideal, but anything larger than 5x7" will work
- one project will benefit from a nipping press if you have one, otherwise as much weight as you can stack on top of your press boards: weights, bricks, heavy books 20-25 lbs (5 bricks) is not too much

Optional

- dividers
- 12x1/4" brass strip available at the hardware store
- mini paint roller (3") and pan plus plastic bag for storage
- whatever tools not on this list you always find useful
- PVA/methyl cellulose mix
- Would be very lovely to have: guillotine, stack cutter or plough

MATERIALS

Unless noted, all materials are grain direction parallel to the spine. Dimensions below are (height) x (width).

German Stiffened Paper Binding w/adhesive text block

- text paper, 64 sheets @ 6.25 x 4.25" (these are single sheets, not folios)
- endsheets, text weight 2 @ 6.25 x 8.5" unfolded (6.25 x 4.25" folded) – these are single folios
- cloth spine lining 1 @ 6.25 x 2.5"
- boards: 20 pt card 2 @ 6.25 x 4.125"
- decorative paper for wrapper 1 @ 6.5 x 9.5" – Anything you like, not too terribly lightweight
- barriers: 20 pt card 2 @ 6.5 x 4.5" (either grain direction, these will not be part of the book)

Double Pamphlet with Tipped Wrapper

- text paper 8 sheets @ 6.25 x 8.5" unfolded (6.25 x 4.25 folded)
- decorative paper for wrapper 1 @ 6.25 x 9.5" – Anything you like, not too terribly lightweight
- thread, #18/3
